<p><b>Make-A-Wish Metro New York and Western New York</b> grants the wishes of children with life-threatening medical conditions to enrich the human experience with hope, strength and joy. Nationally, Make-A-Wish is recognized as one of the top-10 children’s charities in America. The Metro New York and Western New York chapter has been recognized regionally and nationally for its stewardship and workplace culture, has been awarded 4 stars from Charity Navigator, named one of the <i>50 Best Nonprofits to Work For (2010-2012)</i> by The Non-Profit Times, and was a finalist of the 2013 New York Community Trust–New York Magazine Nonprofit Excellence Awards. The chapter has won the prestigious <i>Power of One Award</i>, presented annually by Make-A-Wish America to the chapter that contributes significantly to the greater good of the Make-A-Wish Foundation beyond their own territory, the only chapter to win the award twice.</p> <p>The Metro New York and Western New York chapter serves a 23-county region, including the five boroughs of New York City; Nassau County, Long Island; as well as Buffalo, Rochester and 17 counties in Western New York. The chapter raises more than \$11 million annually, of which more than \$10 million is derived from fundraising. The organization celebrated its 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary and the granting of its 10,000<sup>th</sup> wish in Metro New York in 2013.</p> <p><b><u>Reporting Structure:</u></b> The Director, Philanthropy reports directly to the Chief Development Officer. He/She creates and manages all related policies and procedures that are based on best practices, ensuring the utmost care and consistency of service to our donors.</p> <p><b><u>General Summary:</u></b> <b>The Director, Philanthropy</b> is an integral part of the Make-A-Wish Metro New York and Western New York chapter and is responsible for managing relationships with the chapter’s most generous individuals and family foundations. He/she will be fostering meaningful relationships with donors and prospects in the philanthropic community to advance the Make-A-Wish mission. The Director will be responsible for managing individual relationships and the Philanthropy program as a whole. The Director must be adept at personally soliciting donors, developing long-term relationships with donors and implementing best practices for operating a major gifts program. The Director must be able to think innovatively and creatively in order to steward existing donors as well as find new opportunities. He/She will be expected to execute their annual plan, track and report on progress and meet a specific revenue goal each year. He/She will be working in partnership primarily with the Chief Development Officer, Chief Executive Officer and other Development team members.</p>	



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**Duties & Responsibilities:**

- Manages the chapter's relationships with individual donors, family foundations and prospective supporters contributing or potentially contributing \$5,000 or more.
- Develops and executes a detailed Annual Plan that is integrated with the Development team's Annual Plan and the organization's Strategic Plan to ensure all revenue targets are met within budget.
- Works closely with the CDO and CEO to help build relationships with the organization's top individual donors, family foundations and prospective supporters.
- Works collaboratively with team members, develops and executes meaningful, creative, coordinated and cost-effective stewardship initiatives to thank supporters and engage prospects. This may include, but is not limited to, stewardship events, public recognition, in-person visits, formal presentations, written correspondence, phone correspondence, video messaging and social media.
- Creates and manages all tools (funding menu, recognition opportunities, communications, etc.) to support donor intent and the chapter's needs that are based on best practices.
- Ensures all activity is tracked and mapped out in Raiser's Edge. In addition, ensures all coding is in place to effectively serve, deepen and expand the chapter's philanthropic relationships.
- Works with select senior-level volunteers, encouraging and inspiring them to help identify new supporters and help steward existing supporters.
- Works collaboratively with chapter colleagues and using prospect research, identifies new giving opportunities to be pursued.
- Works closely with Make-A-Wish America (national office) to support key philanthropic relationships with local donors who give nationally.
- Serves as a point person for all major giving information, advice, policies and procedures for the chapter.
- Supports chapter efforts to seek gifts-in-kind by soliciting and stewarding in-kind supporters.
- Maintains compliance with Make-A-Wish of America brand standards and policies.
- Is an ambassador for Make-A-Wish in the philanthropic community supporting positive brand awareness.



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- As a senior member of the Development team contributes to the overall direction and management of the Development team.
- Stays abreast of best practices and giving innovations with a willingness to test new ideas in the chapter.

**Education and Experience**

- A minimum of 10 years of experience required in fundraising, including individual giving.
- Demonstrated success in engaging with supporters and securing gifts of a minimum of \$50,000 required.
- Experience managing outstanding annual major donor programs stewarding high net worth supporters required.
- Expertise in developing relationships with major funders and crafting solicitation strategies to secure results required.
- Bachelor's degree required.
- Capital campaign experience preferred.
- Active CFRE status preferred.
- Proven track record directly engaging high net worth donors in New York City preferred.

- Emotional intelligence to understand and connect with donors and prospects.
- Excellent writing and oral presentation skills.
- Demonstrated ability in project management and long-term relationship management.
- Highly competent working in Raiser's Edge.
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills.

- Demonstrates the highest level of personal and ethical standard with the ability to represent the organization professionally and responsibly.
